

Guild 'keeping embroidery alive' in Ventura County

Hobby group hopes to expand

Ask Michelle Baylis to choose her most meaningful work of embroidery, and her answer will always be the same: a one-of-akind seascape dedicated to her late sister, who loved needle art and walking along the beach.

The co-president of the Channel Islands chapter of the Embroiderers' Guild of America is committed to keeping the art of embroidery alive in Ventura County as the organization approaches its 40th anniversary.

"I want other people to know that we are here and we are a vibrant group," Baylis said.

She and member Mari Bangs, both Camarillo residents, joined the chapter after they retired about four years ago as a way to surround themselves with people who shared their passion for embroidery

"You get a wealth of knowledge at your fingertips by joining," said Bangs, who joked that she has enough pieces to fill a museum.

Each workshop introduces the two to new techniques beyond the traditional crossstitch, including kumihimo braiding and Norwegian hardanger.



"Every time we get together, I learn something," Baylis said.

Hours of embroidering alongside other members has shown Bangs the value of making a pattern her own rather than simply copying it—a form of self-ex- pression that she finds relaxing.

"It can be very meditative," she said. "And at the end, you have a beautiful piece of art."

Despite the benefits of embroidery, membership for both the national guild and the local chapter has decreased over the years.

Since it was established in 1983, the Channel Islands chapter has dropped from hundreds of members to 35. Baylis and Bangs said members are aging out and the leadership teams are struggling to attract a younger membership.

"We are trying to do more outreach," Baylis said.

After two years of inactivity due to the pandemic, the chapter has made an effort to host more community activities, including an open house on Wed., Oct. 26.

The event will begin at 10 a.m. at the Camarillo United Methodist Church, 291 Anacapa Drive.

"We welcome people young and old," Baylis said. "We welcome an exchange of ideas."


















At September's meeting we looked at a simple design for creating these. They are expecting to build 10 new homes next year, so this may be a new opportunity for our Chapter outreach. More details will be forthcoming.
